

California Work and Health Survey 2023 Technical Documentation

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Overview

The California Work and Health Survey is a population-based survey of 4,014 California residents, aged 18-70, conducted between November 2022 and May 2023. It was developed as part of the <u>California</u> Labor Lab, a NIOSH Center of Excellence for *Total Worker Health*®

The survey was conducted by telephone interview or self-completed by participants using a web-based application. All survey administration was handled by Davis Research, LLP. Median completion time was 41 minutes for telephone and 24 for web-based surveys. Regardless of the method of completion, participants received a \$10 gift card in appreciation of their time and effort.

As its name implies, the purpose of the survey was to capture information about the employment and health status of California adults. There are three major sections of the questionnaire, described in more detail below. The first – and longest – section focuses on employment. One special feature of the survey is the collection of information on jobs not worked at in the past week but were worked at in the past month. The rationale is that alternative and contingent forms of employment may be episodic and less likely to be captured in data collection solely about the week prior to interview. The survey includes detailed questions about employment status and, among those working, work arrangements, working conditions, and occupation and industry of the job. Participants are asked about the main job that they held in the past week, defined as the one with the most hours, as well as a second job worked in the past week. Participants who were not working in the past week were asked the same series of questions about a main job that they held in the past month, if any. Participants who were not currently employed were asked when they had last worked. Currently employed respondents were also asked about their longest job held.

The health section includes questions about overall physical and mental health status, along with questions concerning chronic illness diagnoses, functional limitations, pain and other symptoms, perceived stress, occupational injury, height, weight, health behaviors, and health insurance coverage.

The final section includes basic demographic information, including household composition, paid and unpaid caregiving for household/family members, household income and individual earnings, benefit recipiency, and financial strain.

After data collection was completed, sampling weights were developed so that the responses are generalizable to the non-institutionalized California population, aged 18-70. More details on the weighting process are available below.

Sampling Methodology

Sampling Frame

Because approximately 98% of all adults in the target population (Californians 18-70) have a cell phone, only cell phone numbers were used for this project. Random samples of cell phone telephone numbers were purchased from a supplier of telephone samples, using a split frame methodology. The listings included both a pure random digit dial (RDD) sample of cell phone numbers with California area codes and a set of listed cellular numbers of people currently living in the state, regardless of area code. Split frames provide the best chance to include a probability selection for nearly every cellular telephone in California, since so many residents have an area code that was generated outside of the State of California and would be otherwise excluded from the sample frame. To ensure a wide range of income strata in the sample, the listings included phone numbers on both pre-paid and post-paid plans.

This sampling methodology of individuals (via cell phones) negated the need for respondent selection procedures when multiple household members share a landline. It also simplified the post-survey statistical weighting process, described below.

Participation Rates

From 134,725 call attempts, we made 15,164 contacts with potential participants. A total of 9,024 individuals declined to participate or did not complete the interview. A further 2,126 were ineligible due to age, language (neither Spanish nor English), or residence outside of California. A total of 4,014 responded to the survey (26% of contacts made; 31% of contacts after excluding the 2,126 known to be ineligible). A detailed flow chart is included in <u>Appendix 3</u>.

Data Collection Methods

The survey was administered in English and Spanish either by telephone from Davis's computer-assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) call center in Calabasas or by completing an on-line version. Up to eight call attempts were made to reach and interview an eligible subject at each usable telephone listing. Callbacks were made throughout the day and evening hours seven days a week, excluding holidays. Additional call attempts were made to respondents who were found to be eligible for the survey but who did not complete the survey immediately after being administered the survey screening. Those who could not be re-contacted after repeated attempts were then sent email and text message invitations encouraging them to complete the survey online. Because of the length of the survey, many respondents were screened initially over the telephone and then offered the option to finish the study online; they were sent a text or e-mail with directions to finish. If they did not complete the survey online, they received additional telephone calls. Most respondents who began the survey (70%) ultimately completed it.

Screening questions were administered at the beginning of the survey to identify eligible respondents ages 18 to 70 within California. Once identified, eligible respondents were provided with a broad description of the study, its objectives, sponsorship, and auspices. To encourage participation, respondents were offered an incentive of \$10 sent via check or e-gift card from a national retailer.

Weighting Strategy

Sample adjustment weights were developed to bring the survey sample into alignment with known characteristics of the population of California adults ages 18-70, using a common procedure known as raking, also referred to as sample balancing. Raking is an iterative process in which survey estimates are controlled to their marginal population distributions. The raking process can be thought of as a multidimensional poststratification procedure because the weights are post-stratified to one set (or dimension) of control totals, and these adjusted weights are post-stratified to another dimension. This process is then iterated until the control totals for all dimensions are simultaneously satisfied, resulting in the production of a final single weighting assignment for each respondent.

The population estimates of demographic variables (age, sex, and race/ethnicity), geographic variables (counties or combinations of counties), and socio-economic variables (educational attainment and employment status) of the population of California adults ages 18-70 were derived from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2021 American Community Survey (ACS) and from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The specific variables used in creating the weighting targets (either alone or in combination with one another) included: geographic region, gender, age, race and ethnicity, educational attainment, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefit recipiency, labor force participation, and having a pre-paid cellphone plan.

The sample weights [weight] are proportional to the total sample size. These weights range from 0.8 to 6.0 and sum to 4,014. The datafile also includes an expansion weight [weight_pop], which sums to the 2022 California population aged 18-70. These weights range from 534 – 40106 and sum to 26,83,0156. Both weights yield the same percentage of the population for any given characteristic. The sample weight is more useful in calculating statistical significance since it is scaled to the actual sample size of 4,014; the expansion weight permits estimates of how many individuals in the State have a characteristic.

Questionnaire Sections, Usage Notes, and Instruments

The questionnaire began with a screening section, designed to ascertain eligibility for the survey (California residence and age 18-70). The verbal consent to participate was also included at this point in the survey, and gender ascertained to facilitate future skip patterns.

Throughout the questionnaire, variables were coded with -9 to indicate non-response (decline to answer for any reason). Prior to any analyses, users should drop, recode, or impute these values. A missing value in the survey indicates that the respondent was not part of the universe for this question, i.e. that the item was logically skipped in the questionnaire, such as employment questions for those not working.

The sections of the main questionnaire, and any relevant usage notes, are enumerated below:

Employment Section (Q001–163)

The initial questions (Q001–017) determined employment status in the past 7 days, following the methodology of the Current Population Survey administered by the U.S. Bureau of the Census for the Bureau of Labor Statistics.² This part of the questionnaire also provided information about extent of work in the past year, and when last worked.

Questions Q018 – Q058 constituted the "Job Battery." These items contained detail about respondents' current jobs, including occupation and industry; employment arrangements³ including self-employment, independent contracting, on-call employment, working for a temporary hiring agency, and having one's work contracted out; contingent employment defined as work not expected to continue; and working conditions such as the physical and psychosocial demands⁴ of jobs, supervisorial and subordinate status, nature of shift, and flexibility of work.

Currently employed participants were asked about the job that they worked at most in the past 7 days. Those not working in the past 7 days were asked the same series of questions about the job that they worked at in the past 30 days. Participants with more than 1 job (in the past 7 or 30 days) were asked the same basic series of questions about a second job. To reduce respondent burden, fewer questions were asked about a second job in the past week. As a reference –

Q018 - Q058 refer to the job worked (the most hours) in the past 7 days.

Q059 - Q099 refer to the 2nd job worked in the past 7 days.

Q102- Q142 refer to the job worked in the past 30 days (but not the past 7 days).

Occupation and Industry coding. Occupation and Industry data were collected as text responses in the job battery sections above. The NIOSH Occupational Computerized Coding System (NIOCCS)⁵ was used to apply SOC and NAICS codes to the responses. NIOCCS provides a reliability score along with each code. Any response with a reliability <0.8 was manually coded by investigators and staff of the CA Labor Lab, with a secondary review if questions still remained. The codes were applied at the most detailed level possible from the response (up to 6-digits), but at times the responses could not be categorized beyond a 2- or 3-digit code. For all coded responses, a 2-digit and 3-digit level code was created in order to provide increased sample size in each category. Note that the top-level of some NAICS industry codes actually comprise several 2-digit codes (manufacturing [31-33], retail trade [44-45], transportation & warehousing [48-49]). For the 2-digit codes, only the first numbers in each series were used.

ABC Criteria (Q033a-c). The "ABC" criteria are used in California courts to determine appropriate classification as an independent contractor. As part of the project, we developed measures of the ABC criteria for inclusion in this self-reported survey. These items were asked of people who identified

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themselves as independent contractors, as app-based workers, and/or those who stated that they received a 1099 tax form.

Note that Q033b is also a text response, asking for the industry of the company. The intent is to compare the industry identified initially by the respondent with this industry. As of this writing, that comparison has not been made; we have simply provided the codes corresponding to the text response, using the same method as above.

Following the Job Batteries, respondents were asked about displacement from work in the past 3 years, longest job held (occupation, industry, and job tenure), and experience of discrimination at work by category, including gender, sexual orientation, race/ethnicity, age, and disability status.

Main and Second Jobs. As described above, respondents answered questions about one or two jobs held in the past week, one job in the past week and one in the past month, or a single job held in the past month (if they did not work in the past week). The flow of the questionnaire resulted in three different sets of job battery questions – the first 7-day job, the second 7-day job, and the 30-day job. The 30-day job could either be the only job described, or it could be the second job described, depending on the individual respondent's situation. To allow for another way of analyzing these jobs, an alternate set of job battery variables is included in the datafile, referred to as 'main' and 'second' jobs. The main job variables (with suffix "mn") include the responses to either the first 7-day job or the 30-day job when the respondent didn't work in the past week. The second job variables (with suffix "sc") include responses to either the second 7-day job or the 30-day job when the respondent had only 1 job in the past week. These variables are listed in a separate section of Appendix 2. Two variables, [mainjobtype] and [secondjobtype], identify whether the responses are related to a job held in the past 7 days or the past 30 days.

Health Section (Q164–201)

This section included brief assessments of overall physical and mental health status derived from the PROMIS Global Health 1.2 measures⁷, specific common chronic conditions, common symptoms, and physical functioning and limitations, all based on the National Health Interview Survey⁸. It also included the 4-item Perceived Stress Scale.⁹ Employed and recently employed respondents were asked about workplace injuries. The questionnaire asked about health behaviors, including smoking, alcohol use, and physical activity, derived from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey.¹⁰ Height and weight were also queried. The section ended with questions on health care utilization and health insurance coverage.

Chronic conditions. Respondents were asked if they have or are being treated for a chronic condition, defined as a long-term condition that has already lasted or can be expected to last for three months or more. Those who replied affirmatively were asked a list of specific conditions. Some such individuals responded negatively to each of the individual conditions, either because they had one that was not listed, or they were unfamiliar with the name of the condition. We have retained their initial positive response to the screening question.

Demographics Section (Q205–228)

In addition to age and gender, which were ascertained in the screening questions, this section included basic sociodemographic questions — marital status, education (self and spouse, if any), household size and composition, race, ethnicity, nativity, and language spoken at home. Latino, Asian, and Pacific Islander respondents were asked to what country or countries they trace their ancestry, and those born

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outside the US were asked their country of origin. It also included questions about caregiving for children and adult family members.

Race and Ethnicity. Respondents selected as many racial categories as applied, in keeping with common practice. However, respondents could also select Latino as a 'race' category, rather than requiring them to select a non-Latino race category and then ask about Latino ethnicity separately. Respondents who did not select 'Latino' in the initial question were asked if they are of Hispanic origin. Thus, the Census model of separately reporting Hispanic ethnicity and race can be reconstructed here, if need be.

Finances Section (Q229–238)

This section included questions on levels of household income and individual earnings, kinds of income received, benefit recipiency, home ownership, homelessness, and financial strain.

Poverty Level Income. The questionnaire was designed to determine if respondents had household incomes that were at or below 125% of the 2021 Federal Poverty Guidelines, based on their reported household income levels and household size. The CWHS estimate of this poverty level is substantially higher than the California component of other national surveys. One reason is that the CWHS asked more generally about household income than other surveys; it is also possible that respondents misunderstood the meaning of 'household' and included people in the response to the question about household size who were not actually supported by the household income. In support of this hypothesis, poverty rates match other surveys' estimates more closely for small households. Although the poverty rate may not match other surveys, respondents at or under the poverty line in the survey did report other characteristics consistent with low household income, for example low individual earnings, high rates of public benefit recipiency, and reports of experiencing food, housing, and medical care insecurity. The cautious strategy is to use the CWHS poverty variable as a measure of economic level and relative economic position rather than as a way of characterizing the extent of poverty in the State.

Data Issues

Missing Data. The CWHS is a complex survey, with a vast number of embedded conditional statements controlling which questions are presented to the interviewer (or respondent in the case of self-completed surveys). The survey team put the questionnaire through rigorous and repeated tests to ensure accuracy of the underlying logic. Nevertheless, errors arose, mainly due to human error in interpreting the questions or responses. The most noteworthy of these resulted in 34 individuals (0.8% of all respondents) being skipped from the job battery section, even though they appear to have had jobs in the 7 days prior to interview. For any analysis of employment characteristics, these responses should be dropped or imputed. They are indicated with a flag variable called [missingemployedflag]. The individual job battery questions for these respondents are coded with -5.

On call work (Q040a/Q081a/Q124a). In an early version of the survey, the items about working on-call included neither the timeframe nor the definition of on-call work, resulting in a very high proportion of respondents endorsing on-call work (30% among the first 1,204 respondents who worked in the past 7 days). Subsequently, the question was changed to match the CPS Contingent and Alternative Work Supplement questionnaire from 2017.³ In order to use the first set of respondents, we performed an imputation procedure to fill the responses to the corrected question, had they been asked. Random hot-deck imputation¹¹ was used to impute missing values for participants who answered the old version of the questions (recipients) based on the observed values of respondents who answered the new version

of the questions (donors) and were similar to the recipients in relevant variables, based on statistical consideration and the investigators' subjective knowledge of the questions being imputed. A random forest technique was used to evaluate the importance of each variable to predict the response to the new version of the questions, and then investigators evaluated the important variables identified by the random forest based on their subjective knowledge of these variables. For the three questions to be imputed the following variables were selected: survey language, delivery method (phone or web), working part-time and part-year (vs other work patterns), working rotating or variable shifts (vs. other kinds of shifts), and if the job offered health insurance.

Donor pools were created for recipients with same values of the five relevant variables. Then one donor from each recipient's donor pool was randomly selected for the recipient, and the recipient's missing value was replaced with the observed response from the donor. The imputation procedure substantially reduced the estimate of on-call work from 30% to 5.5% (in the main 7-day job).

The variables [q040a_flag; q081a_flag; q124a_flag] indicate which respondents had their answers imputed. The original variables (q040, q081, q124) are also included in the file, for comparison. They should not be used in any analysis.

Perceived Stress Scale (Q176) The 'never' category in the Perceived Stress Scale (PSS) was inadvertently left off the questionnaire, and therefore the lowest value response was 'almost never'. Although this will make the PSS scoring less comparable to other published results, we believe that the responses can still be used to indicate high levels of perceived stress.

Note that the text of the questions is not repeated here. There are slight variations in the wording, just to clarify to the respondent which job is being queried. The question numbers are included in [brackets]. If there are only 2 question numbers for a given question, it indicates that this question is only asked for the first job and is included in the 1st 7-day series and the 30-day series, as appropriate.
